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Cabinet Charge (FS 402.56)

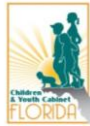
“Design and implement actions that will promote collaboration, creativity, increased efficiency, information sharing, and improved service delivery between and within state governmental organizations that provide services for children and youth and their families.”



Major goals of project

Children and Youth Cabinet Information Sharing System (CYCISS)

- Equip state agencies that serve children, youth, and families with a tool that helps them provide better service in a timelier manner
- Enable the eight Cabinet agencies to exchange and share data quickly, reliably, and cost effectively
- Identify and eliminate service overlaps and gaps between agencies
- Empower agency leadership with tools for more effective decision-making
- Enable agency staff to use resources more efficiently by gathering information more quickly with improved accuracy



System Benefits

- A role based, easy to use query only system – not a data warehouse
- Data stays in place, maintaining the individual agency data integrity, control, and security
- Real time authorized access to data. The most recently posted data is always immediately available
- Will provide as much, real time, up-to-date data and data exchange capability on a child or family as possible in a single view



System Benefits

- System-to-System data exchanges automate labor intensive re-keying of information across agency systems
- A single access system that simplifies training and facilitates better decision making and service delivery
- The system will break down barriers to sharing information and foster a higher standard of best practices for information usage



Northwest Regional Data Center (NWRDC)

- A 39 year history of providing data center services to Florida public sector (state agencies, universities, colleges, city and county).
- A primary data center as defined in Section 1004.649, F.S.
- Administrative and technical support provided for project.
- Infrastructure capacity in place to handle new solution (bandwidth, backup, storage, disaster recovery).
- Experience in working with multiple state agencies (contract management).
- Lower initial cost to agencies.

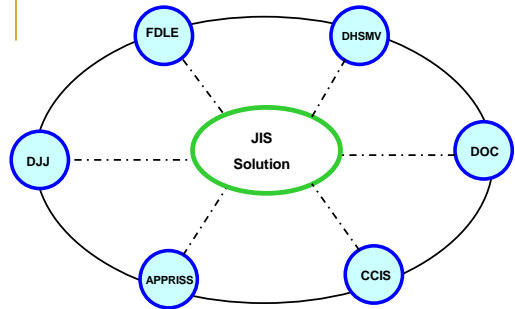


Judicial Inquiry System Partnership

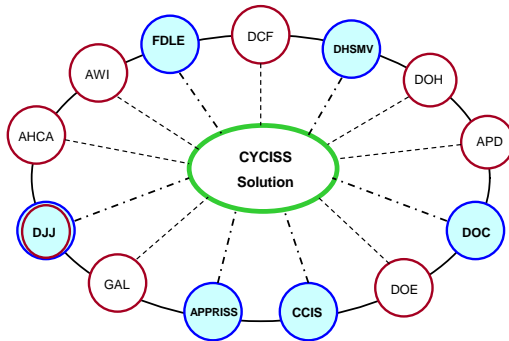
- Initial CYCISS efforts based on partnership with JIS system managed at OSCA, which leveraged an existing solution and saved taxpayer dollars
- For fully authorized users, partnership provides potential access to 21 data sources in a single view
- Access between CYCISS and JIS is segmented and managed separately

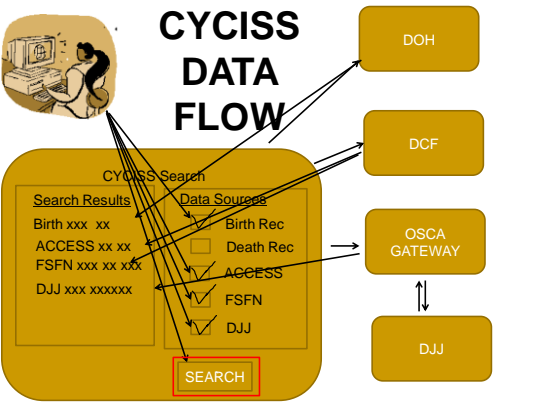
